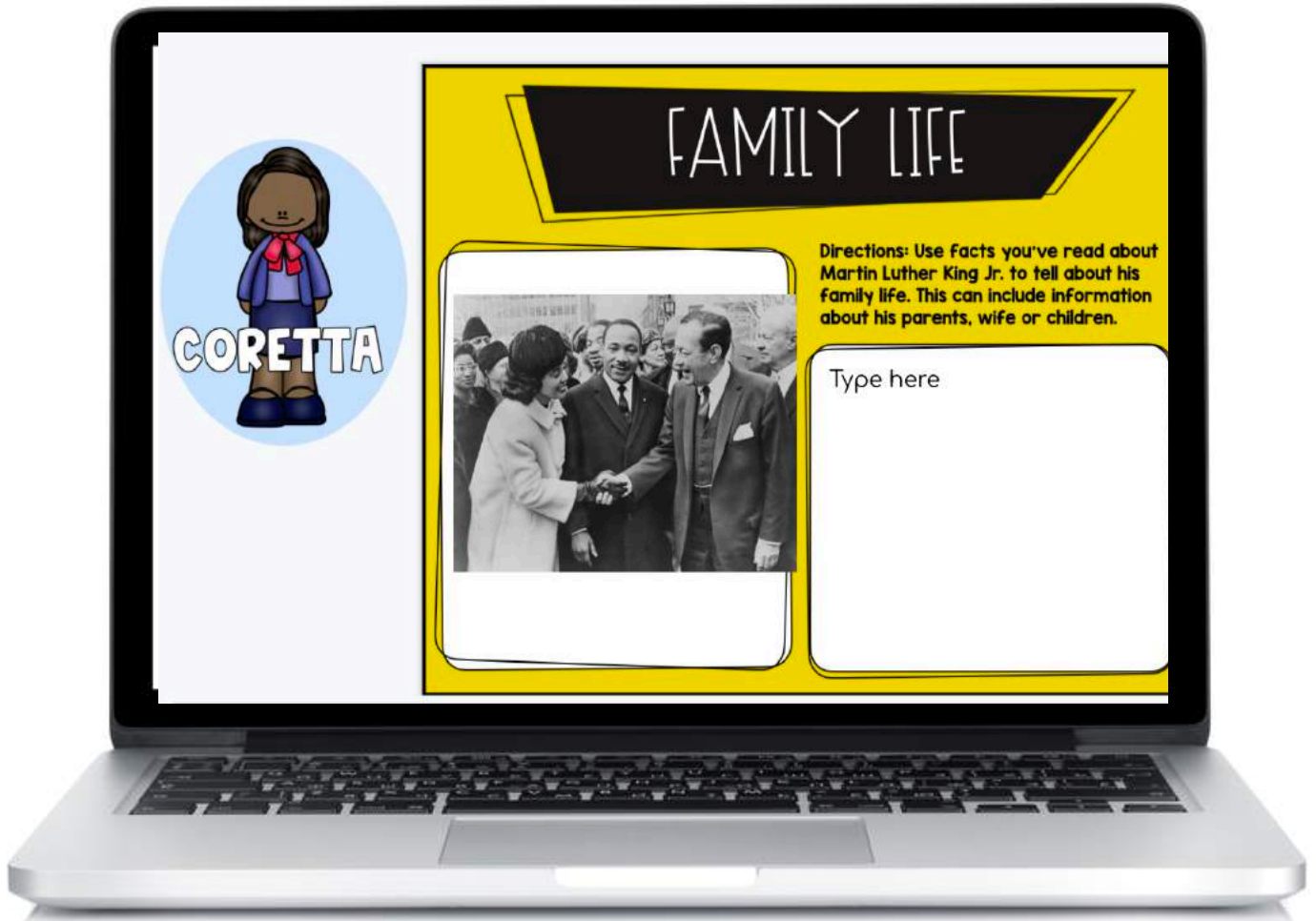

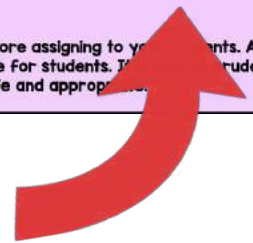



### How to use the Explore Tool

LET'S DRAW A CIRCLE




**Explore Tool**  
1st: Click on explore tool on the **bottom right corner** of the screen.  
2nd: Use the search bar to type what you are looking for.  
3rd: Click on Images.  
4th: Click the image you'd like to use and drag it into your slide. (This step is not shown.)




## Student Help Page

### How to Resize the Image

GO...YOUR PICTURE IS TOO BIG. TRY!




**Resizing Images**  
1st: Click on the picture. You will see tiny blue squares on the corners of the picture.  
2nd: Hover around the blue square at the right corner of the picture. You will see an arrow pointer.  
3rd: **Click and hold** the corner and drag at a diagonal to make the picture get smaller. Resize to the size you want.
